Nanuq Lodge is based on concepts that have made both Sila Lodge and Bathurst Inlet Lodge internationally successful. We believe in owner participation in day-to-day operation, in friendly, compassionate service and in helping our guests get the most they can out of a visit to our community. The décor is warm and welcoming, with northern art by local artists throughout.

### Rooms.

Our rooms are inviting, with comfortable beds and good lighting, beautifully appointed with colourful wallhangings by John's mother, Jenny Tootoo, and other Nunavut artists. Each room offers a TV, phone, and ensuite bathroom with shower.

### Sitting room.

This comfortable gathering place is equipped with refrigerator, microwave, coffee pot, teapot, snacks, television, library of novels and northern books, and a computer workstation with Internet access available to all guests.

### Breakfast.

Continental breakfasts feature fresh-baked breads, cereals, fruit, muffins or croissants, coffee or tea, hot chocolate, hot cider drink or fresh fruit juice. Complimentary evening tea and snacks.

### For business travelers.

We offer access to a desktop computer with Internet access, printer, fax in the common room, or can provide additional office space upon request.

### Handicapped-accessible room.

Nanuq Lodge offers wheelchair access to the lower story, and a room designed specifically to meet the needs of folks with limited mobility. Ensuite bathroom with tub. Internet access is available in an adjacent office.

### Room Rates.

**Double:** (2 people per room)

### Amenities.

Laundry facilities and freezer space. Bikes are available for loan to guests. A small retail area features local art, souvenirs, and products from the Nunavut Development Corporation companies. Kayak rentals.

We'll be happy to help arrange local tours for sport fishing, boating, trips to Iqalugaarjuup Nunanga Territorial Park, or Marble Island. Dogteam rides and tours are sometimes available.
